Since the removal of this feature would not significantly affect the ability of this alternative to meet the purpose and need, SCDOT has elected to remove this bridge from the Recommended Preferred Alternative.

Relative to water runoff, stormwater runoff would be mitigated by discharging stormwater into detention basins and/or vegetated swales before it is released into receiving waters and the project would be designed to be consistent with local floodplain development plans. The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) received public comments in the early stages of the project requesting enhanced connectivity across I-26. To address these comments, the Tram Road and Beatty Road bridge was added to provide connection between Fernandina and Jamil frontage roads. In addition, this proposed bridge would also have benefits for emergency response. As proposed, the Tram Road and Beatty Road bridge would fulfill a secondary need of the project to improve system linkages. However, the bridge does not affect the ability of the Recommended Preferred Alternative to meet the primary purpose and need of the project to reduce congestion and improve mobility in the corridor. Since the removal of this feature would not significantly affect the ability of this alternative to meet the purpose and need, SCDOT has elected to remove this bridge from the Recommended Preferred Alternative.

Relative to your concerns about the I-26/US 378 interchange, improvements were made to the right turn movement at the I-26/US 378 interchange in 2010 as the original ramp design did not operate as intended. As part of the Carolina Crossroads project, the eastbound exit ramp would be improved by lengthening the ramp to provide additional storage capacity. This would prevent traffic backing up onto I-26. You can read more about the traffic analysis and in Chapter 2 of the DEIS (see Section 2.1.7.1).

The selection of interchange types is included in the screening process. The diverging diamond interchange (DDI) type was considered and selected for the I-20/Bush River Road interchange based on its ability to improve traffic flow and reduce congestion. The purpose of this interchange design is to accommodate left-turning movements onto arterials and limited-access highways while eliminating the need for a left-turn bay and signal phase at the signalized ramp terminals. A DDI interchange is expected to be beneficial in situations where high left-turn and through volumes contribute to high delays. The proposed interchanges at 1-26/St. Andrews Road and I-20/Broad River Road are single point urban interchanges (SPUI). A SPUI interchange is

proposed at both interchanges to improve traffic flow. You can read more about interchanges in Chapter 2 of the DEIS and in the associated technical report in Appendix C of the DEIS.

Public engagement efforts to date have included a number of techniques including the use of visuals. A 2D visualization of the Recommended Preferred Alternative is currently available on the project website DEIS online meeting video at www.scdotcarolinacrossroads.com/onlinemeeting5/.

As the project progresses, SCDOT will continue to keep the public informed and involved in the Carolina Crossroads project through a variety of methods as described in Chapter 4 of the DEIS. Additionally, SCDOT plans to use a project delivery system known as design-build (D/B). Under this system, a project is designed and constructed by a single entity, often referred to as a D/B contractor. The D/B contractor through a community outreach program, would also continue to coordinate with the public and would be expected to let the community know things such as the types of closures to expect (i.e., temporary, long-term), when to expect them, and who to contact, if needed. Any signage deemed necessary will also be done during the engineering design phase of the design build contract.

Thank you for your interest and comment on the Carolina Crossroads I-20/26/126 Corridor Improvement Project.

Greystone Boulevard and Seminole Drive are outside of the Carolina Crossroads project area and were not included in the development of alternatives. The I-20/26/126 Corridor is generally defined as I-20 from the Saluda River to the Broad River, I-26 from U.S. 378 to Broad River Road, and I-126 from Colonial Life Boulevard to I-26. In October of 2016, the South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) evaluated and presented 49 design options at each of the different interchanges, including a Northern alignment and improvements to the existing roadway. Intersections at the ramps to the freeways were studied as a part of the alternatives development process with a goal of identifying potential deficiencies and development of interchange improvements that would address those deficiencies. Alternatives that provided a reasonable benefit were moved forward into more detailed design. This process allowed for a screening of potential interchange types based on factors such as traffic flow and safety. When an improvement was characterized as being feasible and having a beneficial impact to the signalized (or unsignalized) ramp termini, it was incorporated into the holistic "representative alternative" concepts. As the detailed design moves forward, further refinement of these improvements is anticipated. The corridors of Piney Grove Road, St. Andrew Road and Harbison Boulevard are outside of the limits of this project; however, the regional metropolitan planning organization for the Columbia metro area engages in periodic long-range planning efforts to account for future growth on the transportation system.

To eliminate traffic conflict points and weaving maneuvers between these interchange locations, the I-26/Bush River Road interchange would be relocated approximately 0.7 miles to the southeast to an improved, full access interchange at Colonial Life Boulevard under both RA1 and RA5 Modified. To further understand the travel patterns on Bush River Road and how businesses may be affected, the project team analyzed origin-destination (O-D) data. Origin is where a trip begins, and destination is where a trip ends. As detailed in Chapter 3.3 of the DEIS (see pages 3-107 through 3-110), the majority of the traffic on Bush River Road is local traffic that is not coming from or going to I-26 via the I-26/Bush River Road interchange.

However, while businesses at the existing I-26/Bush River Road interchange would still be accessible via the I-126/Colonial Life Boulevard and I-20/Bush River Road interchanges, businesses on Bush River Road in the immediate vicinity of the existing interchange would experience an approximate 30 to 40 percent decrease in pass-by traffic during the peak travel hours

The Carolina Crossroads project is not expected to directly increase traffic on St. Andrews Road or Bush River Road. The purpose of the project is to develop a freeway system in this part of the Columbia metro area that is equipped to handle the growth in the area, over the next 20 years. Any traffic growth within the limits of this project are expected to occur with development and increases in population. The Palm Hill Courtyards neighborhood is located outside of the project limits and the traffic study area.

However, it is a reasonable assumption that traffic on Bush River Road and St. Andrews Road, is in part, due to the congestion at the interchange with I-26 at St. Andrews Road. The traffic models of the preferred alternative indicate that there is an improvement to travel speed on St. Andrews Road across the interchange when compared to the "no-build" conditions (Table 6.16, Alternatives Traffic Analysis Technical Memo). This suggests that time spent in congestion after construction of the Carolina Crossroads project will be less than in the "no-build" condition. Section 3.15.1.7 of the Draft EIS discusses indirect impacts to areas adjacent to the corridor. The conclusion drawn is that indirect land use effects would be minimal due to the project.

Furthermore, the project is found to be supportive of planned density, housing, and jobs within the adjacent communities, in part by providing easier access to downtown Columbia, adjacent employment centers, neighborhoods, and regional activity centers. During the alternatives development and screening process for the Carolina Crossroads, several alternatives were developed and evaluated, including a new transportation corridor that would connect I-26 to I-77, also known as the "Northern Alignment." The Northern Alignment was included in the Range of Alternatives due to public desire as evidenced through public comments during project scoping. Additionally, the Northern Alignment has been included in previous regional planning studies.

However, the Northern Alignment alternative would not meet the purpose and need of improving mobility and reducing congestion on the I-26 corridor and was thus eliminated as a solution for this project. Specifically, traffic analysis indicated the construction of the Northern Alignment alternative, either as an expressway or an arterial, would have the potential to attract over 30,000 vehicles per day from the surrounding local network in the 2040 design year. However, the South Carolina Statewide Model (SCSWM) predicts that most of the traffic would be diverted from Broad River Road, and that only approximately four percent of the traffic would be diverted from I-26. If a comparable amount of traffic that would be diverted from Broad River Road were diverted from I-26, then approximately nine percent of the traffic from I-26 would be diverted to the Northern Alignment. Ultimately, the amount of traffic that would be eliminated from the proposed Carolina Crossroads project through implementation of the Northern Alignment is not enough to reduce congestion and improve mobility within the corridor and thereby would not satisfy the purpose and need of the project. It also would not result in improved safety, improved freight mobility, or improved system connections. Therefore, the Northern Alignment was eliminated from further consideration.

Where regulatory floodplains are defined, hydraulic structures will be designed to accommodate a 100-year flood. Where no regulatory floodplain is defined, culverts and bridges will be designed to accommodate a 50-year magnitude flood event (seeDEIS Chapter 3.8, page 3-292). Detailed drainage design will be completed during final design of the project. Relative to trees and vegetation impacts at the Lake Murray Road interchange, impacts would be minor as the only improvements to this interchange would be an upgrade of the existing loop ramps to accommodate the widening of I-26. Additionally, as noted in Chapter 3.9, impacts to natural habitat communities, including forested areas, would be minimized to the extent necessary to construct the project (see Section 3.9.6.2). Specifically, construction activities would be conducted within the disturbed footprint of the existing roadway and utility rights-of-way to the maximum extent practicable. Thank you for your interest and comment on the Carolina Crossroads I-20/26/126 Corridor Improvement Project.

As we do anticipate water and sewer conflicts with this project (as well as other utilities), the actual relocation design in not a part of this project. These conflicts will be coordinated with the individual utility companies, who will manage utility relocation design and construction themselves. It will be the goal of the utilities to provide the same level of service with none or minimal service outages during the project's construction.

With regards to drainage, increases to impervious surfaces and associated runoff has been considered for both reasonable alternatives. As noted in Chapter 3.6 of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) both reasonable alternatives would increase the amount of impervious surface in the project study area (see page 3-240); and as noted in Chapter 3.8, both alternatives would impact floodplains (see page 3-289). Stormwater runoff would be mitigated by discharging stormwater into detention basins and/or vegetated swales before it is released into receiving waters. This practice reduces peak-flow discharge into receiving waters (see Chapter 3.6, page 3-241). Additionally, neither alternative is expected to result in significant impacts to natural and beneficial floodplain values; and the project would be designed to be consistent with local floodplain development plans. Where regulatory floodplains are defined, hydraulic structures will be designed to accommodate a 100-year flood. Where no regulatory floodplain is defined, culverts and bridges will be designed to accommodate a 50-year magnitude flood event (See Chapter 3.8, page 3-292). SCDOT completed a preliminary traffic noise analysis of the two alternatives presented in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS). Those analyses adhered to the State's Traffic Noise Abatement Policy, which was approved by FHWA. In adherence with the Policy, SCDOT will complete a detailed traffic noise analysis on the recommended preferred alternative. That analysis will evaluate the need for noise mitigation measures and determine if noise walls can meet the reasonableness and feasibility requirements of the Policy, where traffic noise impacts are projected to occur. You can read more about the noise analysis and results in Chapter 3.5 of the DEIS.

Relative to flooding and stormwater runoff concerns, increases to impervious surfaces and associated runoff has been considered for both reasonable alternatives. Stormwater runoff would be mitigated by discharging stormwater into detention basins and/or vegetated swales before it is released into receiving waters. This practice reduces peak-flow discharge into receiving waters (see Chapter 3.6, page 3-241). Additionally, neither alternative is expected to result in significant impacts to natural and beneficial floodplain values; and the project would be designed to be consistent with local floodplain development plans. Where regulatory floodplains are defined, hydraulic structures will be designed to accommodate a 100-year flood. Where no regulatory floodplain is defined, culverts and bridges will be designed to accommodate a 50-year magnitude flood event (See DEIS Chapter 3.8, page 3-292). Relative to your concerns about the I-26/US 378 interchange, improvements were made to the right turn movement at the I-26/US 378 interchange in 2010 as the original ramp design did not operate as intended. As part of the Carolina Crossroads project, the eastbound exit ramp would be improved by lengthening the ramp to provide additional storage capacity. This would prevent traffic backing up onto I-26. You can read more about the traffic analysis and in Chapter 2 of the DEIS (see Section 2.1.7.1).

The selection of interchange types is included in the screening process. The diverging diamond interchange (DDI) type was considered and selected for the I-20/Bush River Road interchange based on its ability to improve traffic flow and reduce congestion. The purpose of this interchange design is to accommodate left-turning movements onto arterials and limited-access highways while eliminating the need for a left-turn bay and signal phase at the signalized ramp terminals. A DDI interchange is expected to be beneficial in situations where high left-turn and through volumes contribute to high delays. The proposed interchanges at 1-26/St. Andrews Road and I-20/Broad River Road are single point urban interchanges (SPUI). A SPUI interchange is proposed at both interchanges to improve traffic flow. You can read more about interchanges in Chapter 2 of the DEIS and in the associated technical report in Appendix C of the DEIS.

Public engagement efforts to date have included a number of techniques including the use of visuals. A 2D visualization of the Recommended Preferred Alternative is currently available on the project website DEIS online meeting video at http://www.scdotcarolinacrossroads.com/onlinemeeting5/. As the project progresses, SCDOT will continue to keep the public informed and involved in the Carolina Crossroads project through a variety of methods as described in Chapter 4 of the DEIS. Additionally, SCDOT plans to use a project delivery system known as design-build (D/B). Under this system, a project is designed and constructed by a single entity, often referred to as a D/B contractor. To mitigate for the noise disturbance, noise reduction techniques may be used during construction and could include measures such as not operating stationary equipment within 150 feet of noise sensitive areas (e.g., residences) without portable noise barriers placed between the equipment and noise sensitive sites; and/or not operating powered construction equipment during the traditional evening and/or sleeping hours within 150 feet of a noise sensitive site, to be decided either by local ordinances and/or agreement with the SCDOT. Refer to Chapter 3.5 (Noise) and Chapter 3.13 (Construction) for additional details.

Relative to the sound barrier walls, SCDOT completed preliminary traffic noise analyses of the two alternatives presented in the DEIS. Those analyses adhered to the State's Traffic Noise Abatement Policy, which was approved by FHWA. In adherence with the Policy, SCDOT will complete a detailed traffic noise analysis on the recommended preferred alternative. That analysis will evaluate the need for noise mitigation measures, and determine if noise walls can meet the reasonableness and feasibility requirements of the Policy, where traffic noise impacts are projected to occur. You can read more about the traffic noise analysis and results in Chapter 3.5 of the DEIS.

Relative to roadway widening, it would occur on both sides of the interstate at the location noted in your comment letter.

Greystone Boulevard and Seminole Drive are outside of the Carolina Crossroads project area and were not included in the development of alternatives. The I-20/26/126 Corridor is generally defined as I-20 from the Saluda River to the Broad River, I-26 from U.S. 378 to Broad River Road, and I-126 from Colonial Life Boulevard to I-26. In October of 2016, the South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) evaluated and presented 49 design options at each of the different interchanges, including a Northern alignment and improvements to the existing roadway. Intersections at the ramps to the freeways were studied as a part of the alternatives development process with a goal of identifying potential deficiencies and development of interchange improvements that would address those deficiencies. Alternatives that provided a reasonable benefit were moved forward into more detailed design. This process allowed for a screening of potential interchange types based on factors such as traffic flow and safety. When an improvement was characterized as being feasible and having a beneficial impact to the signalized (or unsignalized) ramp termini, it was incorporated into the holistic "representative alternative" concepts. As the detailed design moves forward, further refinement of these improvements is anticipated. The corridors of Piney Grove Road, St. Andrew Road and Harbison Boulevard are outside of the limits of this project; however, the regional metropolitan planning organization for the Columbia metro area engages in periodic long-range planning efforts to account for future growth on the transportation system.



# Q1 How did you find out about today's hearing?





## Q2 Was the SCDOT staff helpful?





## Q3 Was the hearing time convenient for you?





## Q4 Was the hearing location convenient for you?





# Q5 Did you find the content in the video informative?





## Q6 How was the length of the video?





# Q7 Was the information in the handout helpful?





## Q8 Were you able to use and understand the interactive map displays?





# Q9 Did you sit at the GIS station?





# Q10 Did you visit the Draft Environmental Impact Statement station?







The meeting opened up @ 5:09 PM with Brian Klauk welcoming the NAB attendees with an ice breaker, which included each person's name and neighborhood or business location; why you joined the NAB; and how do you experience noise today?

15 participants were in attendance. 19 total folks were invited to attend.





Mr. Klauk asked the members to identify what section each board member represented. Ms. Rose Nickels represents Bush River Road, Mr. David Jones and Mrs. Cindy Jones represents Whitehall, Mr. Dave Rader represents Woodland Hills, Ms. Donna McGreevy represents Kernby Square, Ms. Jeramie Sherman represents Quail Hollow Village, and indicated this area has been very loud especially since the trees have been cleared along Interstate 20. Ms. Shirley Mabry represents Quail Hollow Village.

3 Interstates + 12 Interchanges + 19 bridges+ 14 interstate miles + 166 roadway miles, and AADT + 134K = the Carolina Crossroads. All tonight's information tonight is available on the SCDOT/CC website.

The process is Phase 1 which includes the NOI, traffic data, EIS, and Scoping which is completed. Phase 2 is to compare alternatives, prepare a draft EIS, and a final EIS, and Phase 3 is the Project Delivery. We are in Phase 2 currently. Phase 2 ends the summer of 2018.

The schedule is on line. The next public meeting will be in September.

Ms. Robinson discussed the goals and objectives of the NAB. The goal is to have a better understanding of noise, lane masses and sheer mass of people, as well as the trucking industry, ports, businesses, local communities. She gave an explanation of noise analysis and decibels, etc., and detailed the FHWA standards of this type of project.

Ms. Robinson also discussed what noise is by showing a video, which is on the website. (Noise is a pressure of vibrations.) Noise reducing features are a part of federal and state policies and regulations. She also discussed measuring noise and how the special equipment is used to measure noise levels at noise-sensitive sites throughout the project area. Ms. Robinson showed photos to the NAB and discussed how the intern counted traffic at the project site. Sound is measured in units called decibels. Heather showed a slide about decibels and spoke decibel talk with the NAB.

The Carolina Crossroads Team members are not making up the abatement policy. FHWA developed this noise abatement criteria, and SCDOT follows the policy on every project for fairness.

Noise Data Collection Overview was explained by Mr. Mike Parsons.

Mr. Parsons explained how the noise data was collected and the noise results thus far by verifing the accurate noise models at the project site. The noise measurements were taken at 11 locations that had a view of the roadway, human activity, or various business and residential areas for a thorough noise model. He included buses, cars, motorcycles in the model as well. The testing is done with free flowing traffic; not peak traffic times. The noise levels were taken at the posted speed limit and after morning traffic for the most conservative noise level. Noise design models are predicted for 20 years. Noise data collection was measured 200-300 feet from the roadway. SCDOT does not underestimate the noise because they don't want to upset the citizens and public.

A total of 2,491 individual noise receptor sites were identified. Sites were within approximately 500 feet of the project centerline and were identified using parcel map information. Ms. Sherman would like to know where the noise receptors are located in her neighborhood.





Noise range of alternatives are being developed now with reasonable alternatives. The noise analysis will help determine which alternative to pick, and determine if the project meets the feasible and reasonable criteria to warrant a noise wall.

What happens if there is a noise impact? A noise wall may be constructed to help eliminate noise. However, there are many engineering considerations when a noise wall will be considered and beneficial and must meet the FHWA criteria. Utilities, ROW, safety, drainage impacts, soil types, environmental impacts, cost, community impacts, etc. are all factors. Alternatives are taken into considered by the public meetings and public hearing. A polling exercise was taken to see what the members about noise. The SCDOT will take the results to change the noise conversation at other upcoming NAB meetings & discussions.

### The next steps....

Share this information with your friends and colleagues. The next NAB meeting will be held after the September PIM. Engineers will be coming up with ramp movements, interchange options, frontage roads, on/off ramps, HOV, etc. will be alternatives presented at the next PIM meeting for the public to share their input. After the PIM, the NAB will meet again to discuss noise feedback. Light rail may be an alternative.

Greystone meeting area was recommended and a starting time at 5:30 is preferred. Questions were asked by the NAB and the Heather, Mike, and Brian answered the questions.

The meeting opened at 5:32 PM with Brian Klauk welcoming the Noise Advisory Board. Attendees went around the room and gave introductions of themselves.

After the introductions, Brian Klauk presented the project overview, schedule overview and facts of the project. Chad Long and Ben Copenhaver presented the Noise Analysis. Following the presentations, questions and comments were received from the advisory board. The questions and responses are below:

- Question: Why didn't you include a HOV lane?
  - Response: We did a HOV study, but it wouldn't get the use that it would if it was a general
    purpose lane. It was determined that the inclusion of HOV lanes is not warranted. The
    recommended preferred alternative would provide improved levels of service, speeds and travel
    times equal to or greater than those an HOV facility could provide.
- Question: When do you plan on moving dirt?
  - Response: We anticipate that a design build team will be selected by late 2019 and construction beginning in Mid-2020.
- Question: On I-26, will the new lanes impede on Berryhill Road?
  - o Response: It will be shifted away from the current interstate because lanes will be added.
- Question: Will work be conducted at night?
  - Response: Yes, there will be some night work, but the contractor will be sensitive about construction noise. To mitigate for the noise disturbance, noise reduction techniques may be







used during construction and could include measures such as not operating stationary equipment within 150 feet of noise sensitive areas without portable noise barriers placed between the equipment and noise sensitive sites; and/or not operating powered construction equipment during the traditional evening and/or sleeping hours within 150 feet of a noise sensitive site.

- Question: Will construction be completed in one phase or pieces?
  - Response: The selected contractor may choose to phase work, the proposed project would likely be built within a single construction contract where the entire project is constructed all at once.
     This would reduce impacts to the traveling public and nearby residences and businesses for a shorter period of time than separating construction into multiple contracts.
- Question: What was the highest dBA level?
  - Response: During the detailed noise analysis the highest modeled level was 76 dBA within a range of 40 – 76 dBA, which represents the maximum predicted hourly equivalent sound level during peak traffic.
- Question: Was the noise study conducted during peak hours.
  - Response: The Detailed Noise Analysis was conducted assuming vehicles are traveling at their fastest speed and generating the most noise. We modeled when traffic is moving and generating the most noise before it begins to slow down.
- Question: Does the design of the barrier help to reduce the noise.
  - Response: Industry standard is using concrete barriers with a maximum height of 25 feet. A change in decibels of 3 dB is where people start to just notice the difference in noise.
- Question: Can the residents come back later to request a wall.
  - o Response: No, not after the Record of Decision has been signed.
- Question: \$35 per sq. feet, per wall; What is this cost based on?
  - Response: This rate is based on other walls constructed and other walls on I-20, the rate is conservative in favor of building a wall. The benefited receptors are scaled to give more homes the benefit.
- Question: Where are the 2 walls that are feasible and reasonable located?
  - Response: The two proposed barriers that were determined to be both feasible and reasonable are Barrier O, located along I-20 eastbound approaching the Saluda River, and Barrier S, located along I-20 eastbound approaching the Broad River.
- Question: Why wasn't Barrier J2 recommended?
  - Response: The Detailed Noise Analysis determined Barrier J2 was feasible, but not reasonable because only 3% of benefitted receivers in the first 2 rows would achieve at least an 8 dBA







reduction from the proposed noise wall. SCDOT's policy indicates that it must be at least 80% to be considered reasonable.

- Question: Why wasn't Barrier R recommended?
  - Response: The Detailed Noise Analysis determined Barrier R was feasible, but not reasonable based on a high construction cost.
- Question: How far out do you look?
  - Response: Noise Receptor Sites were within approximately 500 feet of the outside lane and were identified using parcel map information.
- Question: What is the current dBA?
  - Response: There is enough to impact 78 of the homes in NSA R, which means they are predicted to experience sound levels above 66 dBA during peak hours. With sound waves, computer modeling is required to accurately account for effects such as diffraction and absorption, not just adding decibels.
- Question: When do you plan to build the wall?
  - Response: The construction may begin in 2020 or anytime during the contract period.
- Question: Will you be contacting the media?
  - Response: No, but there are members of the media that follow the project on social media.
- Question: Where is the policy?
  - o Response: The noise abatement policy is located on SCDOT's website.
- Question: How much time does it take for property acquisition?
  - Response: It will begin after the Record of Decision during spring 2019. There may be two (2)
    phases of acquisition with residents being approached during design build phase and during
    contracting phase.
- Question: Will this be the last noise advisory board meeting.
  - o Response: Yes
- Comments:
  - We were told that we would receive a meter/device to place in our yards to capture noise readings.
    - Response: This is incorrect, all noise studies and data collection took place during the preliminary and detailed noise analyses by the project team.
  - There is a limited amount of time to send the noise policy and for residents to vote for the barrier wall.







• Response: The default vote is yes, and that the wall will be constructed unless more than half of the residents responds "no".

After the presentations, Chad Long discussed the next steps of voting for Barrier O and Barrier S. The advisory board was invited to remain to ask additional questions or to view the maps. The meeting ended at 7:02 p.m.

The meeting opened up at 11:00 a.m. with Ladd Gibson welcoming the attendees and explaining the informal format of the meeting and leading introductions through a roundtable. Ladd also explained the next steps in the project by reviewing the DEIS schedule and the upcoming public hearing, and reviewed the purpose of the





meeting. Chad Long then provided an overview of mobility considerations and explained the studies on bus and rail.

Attendees asked several questions and provided comments regarding the studies on bus and rail, which are summarized along with their responses below.

- Lil Mood: Questions boarding numbers, a 2006 study shows 1,200 1,500 boardings. What are current numbers? Would like 10% of project budget focused on rail and DOT to look at more than expanding highways. Does not think SCDOT is taking mobility/rail serious enough.
  - Doug Frate: Explained the tri-state agreement for high speed rail. The 2018 Southeast Rail Plan
    is scheduled to be released early 2018 and will cover inner city passenger rail and commuter rail.
    The Charlotte to Atlanta DEIS, which will tie in to existing DC rail or other lines is expected to be
    completed in 2018. The goal for DOT is to determine what makes the most sense in regards to
    cost and usage.
  - Lil Mood Response: Wants DOT to think of something different. With mass transit running parallel to I-26 corridor and DOT to focus on mass transit and rail within the corridor. She also mentioned the corridor rail plan in Charlotte and how they evaluated the use of BRT/rail/commuter/light rail.
- Samuel Scheib: There are currently two routes on I-126. A new route will be introduced in May 2018 to operate along I-26 to Parkridge.
- John Fellows: Will SCDOT acquire ROW for future transit?
- Reginald Simmons: Explained a COG study for Camden, Newberry & Batesburg and shared the City of Columbia wants a route from Columbia to Charlotte. SCDOT is leading a FRA study which the COG is waiting on before moving forward. He suggested the need to get all parties at the table and determine roles and responsibilities before moving forward with rail.
- Michelle Herrell: Do we have to pay to use CSX line and can we guarantee transit times with increasing port activity?
  - Doug Frate: CSX wants money for use of the lines and they get priority use of routes. Downtown
     Columbia access is also an issue that has not been touched on for this study or discussion.
  - Lil Mood: All those questions are a part of the start-up cost to ensure user success. The costs on the 2006 study are no longer accurate for the corridor today.
  - Ann August: Positive Train Control needs to happen from the safety side.
- Lil Mood: Wants funding for Newberry Route.







Following the discussion around the bus and rail studies, Brian Klauk discussed Park and Ride facilities and their potential role in the project. Brian explained SCDOT plans to look at park and ride facilities during construction and then move into more permanent sites. Questions and comments on park and ride facilities and responses from attendees and staff are summarized below.

- John Fellows: Would the park and ride sites be considered in Phase I? Mr. Fellows would like this to be early in the project and to be a part of a marketing campaign to influence behavior.
  - Brian was not sure about the timing.
- Brian Klauk: Asked if everyone was okay with the sites presented?
  - o John Fellows: Is there an option for Downtown park and ride or Lake Murray and Chapin?
  - Leigh DeForth: Wants parallel routes to I-26 rather than buses on highways. Park and ride sites need to be on Broad River, not close to highway.
  - Ann August: Wants a marketing blitz for people who use the corridor to see how they will travel
    the corridor once construction starts. CARTA doesn't have that data and this will help to decide.

Brian Klauk also discussed HOV lanes and their potential inclusion in the project. Questions and comments on HOV lanes and responses from attendees and staff are summarized below.

- Ann August: How are emergency vehicles factored into the new design?
  - Brian Klauk: The new design will have twelve foot inside and outside shoulders to improve incident response.
- Shane Shaughnessy: With the new multiple purpose lane design how will increased speed help safety?
  - o Brian Klauk: The cloverleaf design and additional capacity will improve safety.
- Leigh DeForth: Suggested using HOV during peak travel times, adding enforcement and install HOV electrical base now for future use.
- Lil Mood: Concerned about the aging population. How do we help the whole population to move around the state?
- John Fellows: Will ramps be metered?
  - o Brian Klauk: It is not considered in Phase I, but can be reconsidered in a retrofit later.
- Leigh DeForth: Would ROW acquisition be wide enough to accommodate ramp metering?
  - o Brian Klauk: Yes, the ramps will be wide enough in design, no additional ROW will be needed.







Brian Klauk then discussed bicycle and pedestrian accommodations for the project. Questions and comments on bicycle and pedestrian accommodations and responses from attendees and staff are summarized below.

- Leigh DeForth: Sidewalks on back of curb are not acceptable, would prefer a buffer.
- John Fellows: The sidewalks on Highway 6 feels better compared to Highway 378 for pedestrians.
  - Brian Klauk: Showed Reasonable Alternative 1 on the screen and explained the ROW green shading and study area.
  - o John Fellows: A 1,000 ft. of bicycle lane won't do much if it doesn't lead to anything. Planning for potential multi-use paths will help even if SCDOT doesn't build them.
- Samuel Scheib: Harbison already has trails but they are not connected. If SCDOT can improve connectivity to trails and road it would be helpful.
- Leigh DeForth: The City of Columbia has GIS data files, bicycle and pedestrian trail data count and sidewalk standards that she will send to SCDOT.
- Shane Shaughnessy: Do you anticipate the future resiliency of this project?
  - Brian Klauk: Yes, the design will accommodate HOV design and bicycle and pedestrians can be accommodated at crossings. ROW will be determined on a case by case basis. SCDOT has to identify locations and give them to design build team.
- John Fellows: Wants to ensure bicycle and pedestrian amenities are considered.
  - Brian Klauk: Let's have another meeting to discuss the bicycle and pedestrian plan and locations in the horizon. Harbison is the only intersection with shared use path we aren't currently examining ten foot path on one side.

Chad Long closed the meeting at 12:40 p.m. and thanked everyone for attending.

Brian Klauk opened the meeting at 1:15 p.m. with a welcome and introductions.

After introduction, Brian Klauk provided a project overview and status update. He then briefly reviewed the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS), public hearing, comment period, and project next steps. The project's next steps include the completion and release of the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) and Record of Decision (ROD). Brian Klauk also provided an update on the procurement process and explanation of the Design-Build process.

Following Brian Klauk's update, he opened the meeting for questions, comments and discussions on the response letter sent to The COMET.







John Andoh stated Lexington County currently provides funding for some routes and he is concerned about a potential lack of future funding from the county and how that will impact routes during construction of the Carolina Crossroads project. John Andoh also shared information of a potential new route in the region.

- Brian Klauk acknowledged and understood his concern and asked that they start with reviewing the FEIS mitigation commitments listed in the response letter sent to The COMET.
- John Andoh did not have an opportunity to review the response letter prior to the meeting. He had the letter with him and asked Brian Klauk to review the highlights of the letter.

Brian Klauk read the commitments list in the letter aloud to meeting participants:

1. SCDOT will work with CMRTA and CMCOG to develop two park-and-ride lots to improve mobility during construction and mitigate congestion resulting from the project. SCDOT would construct the two sites and maintain them during construction of the project. Engineering feasibility, timing and continued maintenance of the sites would be determined in coordination with CMRTA and the CMCOG prior to the start of construction. In the event a permanent site cannot be developed, SCDOT would work with CMRTA and CMCOG to identify and provide funding for existing parking lots that could be leased for park-and-ride use.

John Andoh asked where the two sites would be located. SCDOT proposed interchange Exit 101/I-26 Broad River and Exit 55/I-20 Hwy 6. A specific location was not given due to potential conflicts related to future negotiations in purchasing the property. Jorge Luna explained the evaluation process to identify the proposed two locations.

Brian Klauk shared that the eventual intent would be the transfer of ownership of the facility to another entity once the Carolina Crossroads project construction was complete or sooner. John Andoh inquired if the COMET could be the potential owner of the park-and-ride/s; Brian Klauk replied yes.

2. SCDOT will assist COMET/CMRTA's ongoing efforts through such measures as accommodating, as safe and practicable, transit (bus) stops at interchange locations, which may include bus pullouts In addition, SCDOT will work with CMRTA to monitor bus on-time performance and capacity during construction and in the event that schedule adherence is impacted and capacity is reached, SCDOT will provide support in determining funding for enhanced bus service, based upon a framework to be agreed upon with CMRTA.

John Andoh inquired about additional subsidies for The COMET in case spillover traffic due to construction impacted COMET routes in the area either via increased ridership (i.e. more people using transit vs. driving through the construction site) or on-time performance impacts (i.e. more traffic on state/local roads trying to avoid the construction site). Brian Klauk explained that SCDOT would work with the COMET to monitor ridership and on-time performance throughout and would lease buses to The COMET if needed during the project period to accommodate growth in ridership and schedule impacts. John Andoh stated Lexington County wants the COMET to discontinue the 93X route to Newberry. If that happens, there would be no additional funding to support additional routes in Richland County. The current route costs \$70/operating hour.







Brian Klauk expressed SCDOT's commitment through the life of the project to continue to analyze demand and usage and will assist if needed. Ladd Gibson mentioned that SCDOT has another interstate widening project at MM85-MM101 on I-26 and it is approximately a year ahead of the Carolina Crossroads project. This project may provide a good understanding of what the usage will be and the public's travel habits and ridership. John Andoh agreed with Ladd's comment and inquired what the trigger point would be for SCDOT to consider a subsidy. Brian Klauk explained the goal would be for the project team and The COMET to stay in regular communication and that The COMET would notify SCDOT when they start to notice an increase. Doug Frate also emphasized the importance for The COMET to notify SCDOT of increases or changes as it relates to the Broad River Road route. Lill Mood stated that The COMET has monitoring data that could be provided to SCDOT. Brian Klauk noted that Jorge Luna could be a resource to monitor schedule impacts and ridership changes. Doug Frate requested The COMET provide SCDOT with monthly data in order to determine a base point and identify increases. Doug Frate agreed to be the recipient of this information and would interpret the data for the project team.

3. SCDOT will implement a congestion management tool/commuter services application, like the recently released Berkeley-Charleston-Dorchester Council of Governments Lowcountry Go app, to improve mobility during construction and mitigate congestion by informing commuters of available options such as carpooling, ridesharing, vanpools and other transit oriented options. The app was developed for BCDCOG by HDR and the platform could be used to provide alternate travel options during Carolina Crossroads' construction.

Reginald Simmons mentioned that the AARP is working on a similar app for seniors in the CMCOG region and he would provide contact information for the AARP so both projects can coordinate. Ladd Gibson stated the intent would be for SCDOT to build, launch the app and provide through construction and then SCDOT would be looking to turn over to the CMCOG for eventual use and maintenance.

Brian Klauk concluded the meeting with asking for feedback on the discussed commitments. Lill Mood was pleased with the commitments and believed they were steps in the right direction. John Andoh did not have any comments and was also pleased with the commitments. Reginald Simmons had no additional comments. Brian Klauk informed the group that the project team would move forward with the FEIS including the discussed commitments and adjourned the meeting at 2:00 p.m.

## **SAC Input:**

- Chris Gossett—he thinks the list of purpose and needs presented in the presentation is good with its recognition of congestion and safety. Weaves in and out are horrible.
  - o Has there been any other input on expanding the study area to include a northern connector?
    - Heather Robbins responded it will have to be considered. Not sure how far it will go based on the purpose and need, but it is an option that will have to be considered.
  - Heather then asked "Where would people like to see northern connector terminate?" (Chris Gossett) Killian near 77 was the study area years ago, not sure where it ties back into 26
    - In regards to purpose and need, is it regional mobility or just for the corridor and then that will help evaluate the project?
- Heather helped the group by defining "System linkages" and other technical terms including weaving, freeway, and flyover.
- Lil Mood goals are great but typically she sees a very limited scope as to what alternatives are even seriously considered. Too much is dismissed out of hand. There is an existing rail that follows the entire







- corridor. There is data for years that says it's feasible. Every solution is not more asphalt. Admits there is something that needs to be done for the roads, please don't' close eyes to other parts of solutions.
- Chris Shelton Every moment I-26 sits still in one location it backs up in other locations and then in turn we get more secondary collisions.
  - Incident signage is a big thing. Large number of sign boards posted, but they need to go further out –The existing sign boards seem to be where the accidents are happening and not where they can effectively warn motorists of the dangers ahead.
  - In Lexington there are 4 500 traffic incidents a month, On I-26 it's usually 5 10 a day. High traffic periods such as the mornings and afternoons increases chances of traffic incidents.
  - Look at where traffic diverts to when there are accidents. Currently if the corridor is shut down, it shuts Columbia down. It can be incredibly difficult to set up a detour due to the restrictions and limited options for traffic flow.
  - Was that ever the idea of going completely around Columbia.
- Mike Soenfeild Broad River and St. Andrews becomes impassable and gridlocked for emergency
  vehicles if there's an incident on the corridor. Need to look not just at the corridor but also what feeds
  into it. Think about what is affected when the corridor breaks. Look wide enough at what feeds into it
  and what causes it.
- Dan Mann agrees there are no alternatives when something goes wrong. Really think that the outside roads should be looked at too.
- Joe Jones Just looking at the areas he's in, it seems that all of the roads leading into i26 and 20 need to be expanded too. Can't just look at the main roads. Frequently the exit off 26 to Lexington is backed into the interstate. Does not think that only expanding the corridorwould fix the problem. Need to convince businesses to go on flex time so not everyone is leaving at 5pm every night.
- Rick Todd Agrees that FHWA and SCDOT know what's' going on. Agrees with what was shown on the slide and presented by others.
  - Effect on trucking association members costs time fuel money, safety. Car drivers don't yield to the trucks or understand the operational challenges of the drivers. Need for more driver education.
  - Many trucking vehicles are simply passing through, not commuting, so no discretion when they can come through.
  - o If the trucks don't have to be there during rush hour they won't be there during rush hour.
  - Not a lot of route flexibility.
- Craig H if you make the arteries bigger, more people will go through it, so need more arteries. North connector, flyover etc. What about double express lanes?
- Lil Could you consider a flyover covering the whole thing for an express type lane?
- Clifford the biggest issue is weaving. Southeastern Freight tries to route drivers away, but it is an absolute nightmare trying to deal with cars weaving.
  - Going from his Southeastern Freight facility to the upstate they don't make that run until the
    evening. During day time operation they run city routes and they just try to stay away from the
    corridor in general. Keep their trucks on secondary roads and routes







- o Would SCDOT be open to doing a presentation for a large group if requested?
  - Response to question was Yes, but ideally after the public meetings as that may answer most of the questions.
- Kerry Powers Traversing the corridor was the most stressful part of her day. Safety is the biggest concern. The weaving is unbelievable.
  - o Is there any consideration for HOV lanes? It encourages people to carpool and have less cars
- Chuck Whipple Driver education is a component of it.
  - 4 cars stacked across the lanes there will cause congestion no matter the road design. Be respectful of trucks, bikes, etc. that alone could ease some of the congestion faced across the midlands
- General Statements:
  - Direct link to the convention Center (off hand/joking comment)
  - What about adding Bike or Pedestrian lanes? I—26 acts like a barrier
- Lil Mood Busses would help get some cars off the road. The one thing the busses can't solve is they are still stuck in the same traffic as everyone else, but if there was an HOV lane it could utilize that.
  - Light rail means you need an outside power-source...third rail or cable overhead. Too expensive.
     You could have commuter rails that use existing infrastructure. Better word is to simply state
     "Rail"

The meeting opened up at 1:08 PM with Theresa McClure welcoming the SAC attendees and introducing Brian Klauk and Chad Long from SCDOT. Attendees went around the room and gave introductions of themselves.

After introductions, Brian presented the project schedule and played the Reasonable Alternatives video. Following the video, Brian explained and compared Reasonable Alternatives 1 and 5 and received questions and comments from the committee. The questions and responses are below.

 Please show the new path from I-20 WB to I-26 WB/St. Andrews Road. This is one of the worst back-ups during PM Peak.

Response: Brian Klauk walked through proposed ramps at this location.

How many total lanes at the I-26/St. Andrews Road locations?

Response: Brian Klauk showed the typical cross sections to answer this question.

How do you exit now that Bush River Road exit is removed?

Response: On the Reasonable Alternatives map, Brian Klauk showed the relocated, new full-access interchange at Colonial Life Boulevard and I-126. He also highlighted that the existing interchange at Bush River Road at I-20 would be upgraded.

How wide is the proposed cross section?

Response: The width of the proposed cross-section varies, but at its widest point, it is easiest to think of it as just under the length of one football field.

• How many lanes will directional ramps have?

Response: 1-2 lanes.

Are there ways for local traffic to get around without having to get on the interstate?







Response: All existing local frontage roads would remain open.

Will access at I-26/Bush River Road change?

Response: Brian Klauk explained the significant changes at Bush River Road access and stated that access will be provided at the existing Bush River Road/I-20 interchange and the Colonial Life Boulevard interchange will be expanded to a full access interchange to provide access to Bush River Road.

• How will SCDOT approach construction?

Response: Brian Klauk explained that there would be a huge focus on maintenance of traffic during the design build selection process and contractors will be evaluated on their approach.

### • Comments:

- Lil Mood: Would like 10% of project devoted to mass transit/commuter rail options included in the design. Brian Klauk responded by saying we would convene separate, interest-specific groups in the near future.
- Rick Todd: From a trucking perspective, they would like to see no loop ramps (having to slow down/speed up) and no conflicts with merging. He asked how many lanes would be on each ramp. Brian Klauk answered that it would vary.
- Michael Dawson: At I-26/I-126 at the Saluda River, there are proposed upstream projects along the river, including a bridge across the Saluda for bike/pedestrian access. He would like for SCDOT to consider these projects during development of the I-20/26/126 project.

After the question and answer session Chad Long provided an overview of the public meeting, online meeting and outreach statistics. He also explained where we are in the process and the next steps. The committee recommended reaching out to residential and community groups in the downtown area.

After the presentation, committee members were invited to view the Reasonable Alternatives maps located around the room and provide additional suggestions and comments. The meeting ended at 3:00 p.m.

# **Meeting Notes:**

### **Introductions**

Theresa McClure opened the meeting with introductions and an explanation of the meeting's purpose and format. Following introductions, a video was shown that provided an overview of the project, explained the Recommended Preferred Alternative (RPA) and the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) – this is the same video used at the Public Hearing and can be found on the project website www.SCDOTCarolinaCrossroads.com. Theresa McClure introduced Environmental Manager Chad Long to review the environmental screening process used to identify the RPA. Project Manager Brian Klauk reviewed the benefits of the RPA and provided a "drive through" outlining the mainline and interchange improvements. Chad Long showed the preliminary noise barrier locations and described the preliminary noise analysis. He also detailed the public outreach process to date. Brian Klauk closed the presentation with details about the project schedule and next steps before asking for questions from those present.





### Comments/Questions, Responses, & Next Steps

Interest in a traffic incident management plan and how EMS can be involved in such a plan.

Response: While the Request for Proposals (RFP) process to determine the selected design-build team is a secure process without public disclosure, teams will be judged on how they plan to handle traffic through construction.

Next Steps: Get together with EMS for feedback on emergency management during construction.

When will construction start and how long will it last?

Response: Construction is expected to begin in 2020 and could last between 5 -7 years. With a single contract that includes both the final engineering designer and the contractor or builder, the Design-Build construction method incentivizes a shorter time schedule.

How are hazardous sites managed?

Response: The location of the hazardous sites are identified within the DEIS. How these materials from these sites will be removed, stored, or managed will need to be addressed by the selected Design-Build Contractor.

 Beyond having meetings of the mobility committee, what was seriously considered and what was rejected and why? Is there an HOV lane designated? Could there be more park-and- ride services along I-26, at least during construction?

Response: A congestion management study is outlined in an appendix of the DEIS document, which can be found at the project website – <a href="www.SCDOTCarolinaCrossroads.com">www.SCDOTCarolinaCrossroads.com</a>. Passenger traffic rail comes with many challenges including access to the rail lines, costs, and staff support. Because of the expected speeds once construction is completed, HOV lanes were not recommended. There will be a Park & Ride study performed and effort to make bike-ped accommodations within the interchanges. The project team is very interested in thoughts about transit during construction.

Next steps: Meet with John Andoh of The Comet to look at using additional commuter bus line(s) with park and ride during construction.

 Will there be coordination between the Carolina Crossroads project and the Saluda Riverwalk which is being transferred from the River Alliance to the city of West Columbia in December or January?

Response: The project team has had conversations with the City of West Columbia and expects to have more.

Next Steps: Coordinate with the City of West Columbia on projects within the study area.

• How will Carolina Crossroads coordinate with Richland County Penny Tax projects such as Broad River, Three Rivers Greenway, sidewalk improvements, and neighborhood improvements?







Response: Broad River improvements in Ballentine is outside of this project, but SCDOT does want to coordinate however we can with Richland County.

Next Steps: Arrange meeting with Richland County's Penny Tax program.

• The Saluda River Bridge project is within SCDOT right of way but is not included in this project. Will SCDOT work with the Saluda River Bridge project to create a categorical inclusion during the EIS?

Response: We will look into this.

Next Steps: Coordinate with the City of West Columbia on projects within the study area.

 Will there be a loss of lane capacity in the westbound direction during construction? If so, this could be a problem during hurricane evacuations.

Response: SCDOT plans to mandate that three lanes of traffic are open at all peak travel times and requires all construction projects to clear traffic lanes during holidays and storm events.

How does this project line up with the widening of I-26 between mile markers 96-81?

Response: The two projects meet end-to-end and the two teams are meeting constantly. There will be 4 lanes through this project and mile marker 97 from which there will be 3 lanes to I-85.

Does this project include benefits at I-26 and Sunset?

Response: The I-26 and Sunset intersection is just beyond this project's eastern boundary but this project adds an extension and repaying of the exit lane onto this interchange from I-26 Eastbound.

Is there a standard distance to the Right of Way line throughout the project?

Response: We show the addition of more right of way for the fly-over ramps but much of this project is being built within the existing right of way. Because the purchase of additional right of way requires additional costs, it is expected the Design-Build Contractor will try to design the project with even less right-of-way purchases that those expected by the RPA.

• What will be the overall costs? Will it be one Design-Build team? Will local firms be included on the teams?

Response: The overall costs are expected to be around \$1.46 Billion. The RFP process will seek a single Design-Build team to be responsible for the entire project and while the lead firm may be based out-of-state, many local firms are expected to be included.

Brian Klauk closed the meeting at 2:20 pm with a reminder about the DEIS Public Hearing on August 23rd and invited those who had additional questions to feel free to stay and speak to the project team.
